Background

Given the importance of providing statistics on gender, national statistical office in Egypt (CAPMAS) in cooperation with UNICEF set up a research unit under the name of women, children and gender in 1998, this unit undertakes all the statistical activities related to the issuance data on gender in Egypt.

CAPMAS is preparing a year book concerning the status of women and men in Egypt, and has launched the database (EGYINFO) in cooperation with the UNICEF as tool to follow up the overall development and indicators of the MDG with 174 indicators classified by gender including the concepts, definitions and the metadata. CAPMAS is issuing more than 120 current statistical bulletin classified by gender in addition to many studies like "the status of women and men in Egypt" and "Egyptian women in leadership positions". CAPMAS has conducted the General Census on population and Housing in 2006 taking into account classification of most outputs by gender.

Objectives

The main objectives/ Tasks of CAPMAS in gender statistics are:

1. To cover all the statistical activities to be able to complete all gender statistics indicators specially the ones that include emergency issues.
2. To analyze the data from a gender perspective by training our statisticians






A gender observatory will be established a gender observatory by CAPMAS. The main objectives of the observatory are:




1. To provide documented information of the gender to the official authorities and policy makers as well as international and regional organizations.
2. Assure that most data sources and information are national.
3. Communication with the centers specialized in the affairs of women for exchanging information and documentation.

Tasks:




1. Monitoring gender statistics
2. Monitor events and news related to women
3. Follow-up all local, regional and international conferences and agreements in the field of women
4. Use other data sources such as field surveys and questionnaires varied
5. Follow-up all materials published in the press, satellite TV and the internet related to women
6. Establish a paper and electronic library for women
7. Publishing researchers, studies, articles and lectures pertaining to women
