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Definitions

- ICT Strategies: Done
- Pan-Arab: A consortium of:
 - ESCWA member states: (Beneficiary)
 - Other Arab countries (Partnership)
 - Friendly supporting countries (Support)
- International Development: (Assistance in funds and/or knowledge by donors)
- Deglobalization within the context of he above (To come)

Globalization

(General)

In general terms:

enabling wider scope and remove restrictions for global trade

Multinational corporations have more control

National interest looses priority

Socio-economic and political decision making becomes subject to pressures and under influence of foreign powers

Globalization

(for ICT)

In ICT terms:

Enabling priorities and strategies that serve wider scope, hence less sensitive to the nation's needs trying to conform to international requirements

Change of current strategies by importing foreign almost ready-made strategies

National decision making is influenced by such strategies

Deglobalization of ICT

Must be


- Sensitive to realistic and pragmatic national development plan
- Cross-sectorial in nature, and hence should affect all country's way of life, not only trade and international relations
- Sensitive to nation's socio-cultural characteristics and priorities


Methodologies: I

- Mathematical modeling of scales to measure indicators describing country's way of life,
- Scales and measures that represent general development strategies (in economics, industry, education etc.)
- Adopting weighing pattern to represent nation's priorities


Methodologies: II

- 1. Construct a current status report, with field data gathering based on the measures and indicators adopted.
- 2. Use expert-driven method (such as the eForesight method) to generate prototype plan (draft version).
- Use cross sectorial expert discussion workshop to test the prototype in terms of the nation's development strategy
- 4. Finally, assess the changes (positive or negative) of implementing such a strategy on the nation's international relations (i.e. general globalization) and make amendments to the strategy in order to minimize the negative effect of the deglobalization.









The 3 D's

- Deglobalization to sustain national identity vis-à-vis the Information Society
- Decentralization for localization of the deglobalized part of the ICT
- Divestment in the sense of selective Investment to constrain and control the effect of large corporations

If we, in Palestine, did this we would have avoided:

- Doing IT strategy three times (first is in 1996 WB)
- Doing ICT Strategy two times
- Doing Agriculture Environment Strategy
- Overhead cost lost in ICT & IT "strategies" is estimated at about 80% (redundancy)
- Each plan's "cost" ranged from 260,00 to even 700,000 US \$

Result: Tons of papers and grams of action
