

Shared Socio-economic Pathways (SSPs)



- Elaborated as "reference pathways"
- Assuming "no climate change or climate impacts, and no new climate policies".

- 1. To better inform the Representative Concentration Pathways (RCPs) that serve as "inputs" for Computer Climate Model (CM) simulations.
- 2. To serve as a basis for IAM scenarios that better reflect their outputs.
