

The Arab Region is particularly affected by and concerned with the issue of desertification and land degradation. More than 40% of the total Arab region are sensitive to land degradation and desertification.

Land degradation neutrality aims to maintain and increase the amount of healthy and productive land resources, in line with national development priorities. Land degradation neutrality has been emphasized in the process of negotiation for the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and is part of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

Responding to these concerns, The United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia holds this Web Conference as part of the international celebrations to mark the World Day to Combat Desertification and Drought in June 2016. The Web Conference aims to raise awareness of the importance and urgency of addressing the problem of land degradation, as well as discussing the modalities for measuring land degradation and desertification as an indicator for land degradation neutrality.
