





Top ranked Massachusetts scores almost four times higher than bottom ranked Louisiana










## FIGURE 3 What does gender equality look like to you?

# Women face serious security and justice constraints

Nearly 80 percent of men feel safe walking within a mile of their neighborhood at night, but only 56 percent of women

University of Chicago's General Social Survey.

"Just walking down the street because I'm a woman makes me feel unsafe. Men stare and whistle to get my attention, when clearly I'm just minding my own business and I want to be left alone."


### Gaps in legal protection

The state in which a woman lives determines her ability to file a workplace sexual harassment claim, her level of protection from an abusive partner, and whether she can take paid time off for caregiving.

#### FIGURE 1.4 No state offers full legal protections of women's rights; some offer none

#### FIGURE 3.6 Two-thirds of adults believe that access to abortion is important to women's rights

Responses to the question: "In your view, is access to abortion an important part of women's rights and equality, or not?"

Overall support for women's sexual and reproductive healthcare is strong, with 65 percent of adults believing that access to abortion is important to women's rights.


However, support is much lower among Republicans.

# **Key factors explaining performance**

Multivariate analysis finds that states which do better tend to be :

- More urban
- Controlled by the Democratic party for more years
- Less racially diverse
- Richer






Number of places higher or lower in index ranking than in real GDP per capita ranking


# Only one state currently has gender parity in political representation






FIGURE 3.4 Democratic women hold twice as many state legislature seats as Republican women, 2020
