

Organization of Work (Note from the Executive Secretary

The fifth session of the Economic Commission for Western Asia will be held in Beirut from 2 - 6 May 1978.

Opening of the Session

The session will be opened at 11.00 a.m. on 2 May 1978 by the head of the delegation of the Hashenite Kingdon of Jordan, the Chairman of the fourth session.

Shortly before the opening of the session, at 9.00 a.m., an unofficial closed meeting will be held by the heads of delegations to the session in the presence of the Executive Secretary, his Deputy, the Secretary of the Commission and the Chief of the Division of Administration. At this meeting, as has been the custom in the past, the heads of delegations will discuss natters related to the session and its proceedings.

Organization of Work at the Session

The session will hold two meetings each day and may decide to adopt the following timetable for meetings:

Morning neeting from 9.00 hrs. to 12.30 hrs. Afternoon neeting from 16.30 hrs. to 18.30 hrs. The Commission may decide to consider the items on the session's provisional agenda in the following manner:

Items 1 - 5 : Opening neeting - norming of 2 May 1978

Items 6 and 7: Afternoon meeting - 2 May 1978

Morning meeting - 3 May 1978

Item 8 : Afternoon meeting - 3 May 1978

Item 9 : Morning and afternoon meetings - 4 May 1978

Items 10 - 12: Morning and afternoon meetings - 5 May 1978

Closing of the Session

The Commission may decide to suspend its meetings on the morning of 6 May 1978 in order to enable the Rapporteur of the session to complete preparation of the annual report for distribution to the delegations at 12.00 hrs. on the same day.

The Commission may decide to hold its closing neeting at 17 hrs. on the afternoon of 6 May 1978 for adoption of the Commission's annual report to the Economic and Social Council, this being the last item on the provisional agenda.
