As part of the project, TDD will therefore focus on the use of new technologies and technological

trends, such as open data, citizen-centric eservices, and e-participation to facilitate the implementation of open government thus allowing the provision of innovative and inclusive services to citizens and stakeholders. The project will also promote the integration of government services, interoperability and the use of standards at national and regional levels.

The purpose of the planned activities is to create awareness, promote the use of new technologies. and build the capacity of governments.

Planned activities include:

- Studies, policy guidelines and training materials on open government, engagement and innovation in public sector;
- Expert group meetings;
- Regional and national capacity building workshops on concepts and technologies;
- Advisory services for ESCWA member countries on the use of emerging technological trends in government services.
