Recommendations of the Working Groups on Training Needs/Gaps and Format on Violence against Women Data Collection and Use

## TRAINING NEEDS/GAPS

- 1. Data collection using innovative methods, including new technologies.
- 2. Statistical analysis, including definitions and methods for calculating indicators.
- 3. Experiences and standards for collecting data on new forms of violence, including cyber violence.
- 4. Standards for the measurement of the economic cost of violence.
- 5. Survey work/data collection in conflict / displacement / asylum communities.
- 6. Sampling (design, size and other considerations).
- 7. Establishment of consultative committee(s).
- 8. Developing interviewers' skills to communicate and establish rapport with women interviewed, particularly around sensitive issues (i.e. sexual violence).
- 9. Safety and ethical considerations.
- 10. Ensuring the survey content (questionnaire, issues being explored) is relevant to the objective of the survey.
- 11. Digital preparation of research budgets for survey planners.
- 12. Experiences and methodologies for publishing and disseminating survey results and ensuring data are used for policy and programming

## TRAINING FORMAT

- 1. Training of trainers.
- 2. The training must be face to face and the duration proportional to the contents (from a week to a maximum of two weeks).
- 3. Training methodology should be relevant to the training objectives and content.
- 4. Use of technology in the development of training models to overcome the problems of mobility.
- 5. Engage all relevant partners, including civil society organizations.
